Despite the pandemic and the restrictions we have all had to endure this year has been surprisingly busy for Musicworks. At the start of lockdown we were unable to run our live Heron Music café for Well Being sessions at the Poppy and Pint so we decided to try running something online to help to keep people connected. What started out as an experiment, to see if we could help to maintain contact between those who would have attended the live sessions, has far exceeded our expectations. The virtual sessions have been posted on the Musicworks Facebook page and YouTube Channel since April 2020 and have been viewed an incredible 80,000 times (and counting!). We know that we are joined by many of our regulars from around the Rushcliffe area, but we have also found an audience across the country indeed we have had messages from Australia.

We became very aware that some of our café participants did not have an internet connection to access our online sessions. To combat this, in December we started a campaign to raise money to create DVD's containing four café sessions that could be given to those who were not able to join us online.
