Report from County Councillor Penny Gowland

There are significant problems with school admissions at age 11 this year. We need dedicated school buses as well as every local school stepping up to take as many children as possible. It would be great to understand if admission rules could be revised. We also need a new school. Apparently, no academy responded to the tender to build one which was put out recently, so I think the County Council need to investigate the possibility of doing this. The state of the Lady Bay School remains a matter of concern. I have been trying for some time to arrange a meeting with the relevant Cabinet member about both of these matters.

Plan to close County Hall & turn it into flats etc.: In recent months the County seem to have been actively encouraging staff to work from home, they now close County Hall for extended periods around public holidays. I am hearing multiple reports of the County not providing normal service because staff are not in the offices. If you are aware of people not being able to meet you, answer the phone at sensible times or similar, please let me know so I can follow this up.

I am acutely aware that nothing has been done about football match parking or parking for the takeaways on Trent Boulevard. I am still trying to work on this with Via.

Community Support Scheme

We distributed all our remaining funds for the year 2022-23, with a donation to Lady Bay Pre school for their wormery to help with waste food reduction and to Nottingham Bikeworks to enable them to set up in Lady Bay on Trent Boulevard.

Rushcliffe Borough Council are reducing the councillors' Community Support Scheme funding from £1,000 to £500 per councillor in 2023-24

Rushcliffe Borough Council Elections

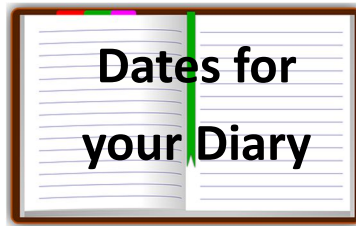
We are writing this prior to the Rushcliffe Borough Council election and it has been an honour to represent the people of Lady Bay ward for the last several years. Hopefully we will have been re-elected and be able to give you further updates in future.

You may be aware that, although the number of councillors on Rushcliffe Borough has stayed the same at 44, the boundaries of many of the wards have changed quite radically. Lady Bay ward has been extended to the south of Radcliffe Road as far as Davies Road such that about 40% of it now lies outside the historical Lady Bay area that is covered by this newsletter. Nonetheless we have been working for many years with communities in both parts of the ward.

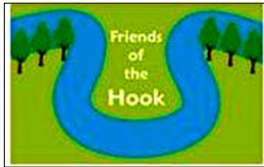
